

## Danish Ministry of Education Scholarship Scheme for highly qualified Non-EU students enrolling in an Academy Profession Degree Programme or a Professional Bachelor’s Degree Programme

### The scholarship may consist of two parts:

- A reduction in your tuition fee (in full or in part)
- A grant which is paid out to beneficiaries in one or more installments (up to DKK 8559,00 per month)

Students may be granted a reduction in the tuition fee only, or a reduction plus a grant.

### Scholarship may be granted for the following semesters:

### Principles for awarding scholarships:

- The academy only receives a limited amount of funding every year for scholarships. Therefore we are not able to award all applicants scholarship. Even students who meet the below criteria are not guaranteed a scholarship. This – combined with the fact that the intention of the scholarship scheme is to attract “highly qualified students<sup>2</sup>” to Denmark – means that we will base our selection of beneficiaries on academic merit and study activity.
- For AP programs, students can only apply for one semester at a time.
- Students in AP programs may be granted scholarship if they have passed the previous semester with a mark average of at least 7 and a satisfactory attendance. In case of pass/no-pass exams, lecturers will be asked to give a mark/assessment.
- Applicants for the BA in International Hospitality Management who are holding, or expect to graduate with, a Danish AP or similar Degree must apply for semester 1 and 2 together. In order to get a scholarship, such students must have passed their AP Degree with a mark average of at least 7 and a minimum of 7 in the final exam project. If students fail to meet this condition, they may apply for a scholarship for their 2<sup>nd</sup> semester, only. In this case a scholarship may be granted if the student passes the first semester with a mark average of at least 7.
- If a beneficiary does not show acceptable student activity during a semester for which he or she has been granted scholarship, the academy reserves the right to withdraw the scholarship.
- Please note that the size of scholarships and number of beneficiaries depend heavily on the amount of funding the academy receives from the Ministry of Education for this purpose. Therefore, no one is automatically entitled to a scholarship, or if granted, a scholarship of a certain size.
- Tax: Grants are regarded as income and therefore most students will have to pay tax of their grant (not tuition fee reduction). Students from certain countries are exempt from paying tax. If you receive a grant, be sure to give the Academy you so-called A-tax card.

### Application Deadlines

AP Degrees:	applying for scholarship for 2 <sup>nd</sup> semester:	1 December
	applying for scholarship for 3 <sup>rd</sup> semester:	1 June
BA Degree:	applying for semester 1 and 2:	1 September (students holding a Danish AP Degree or similar) <sup>3</sup>
	applying for semester 2:	1 December
